

Students discovered erratics and xenoliths, while searching for evidence of glaciers in the form of polish, striations, grooves and chatter!

Plentiful examples of the forces of weathering were also visible as got out their rock hammers, and magnifying glasses. All of this took place atop the Sierra Nevada Batholith (did you know that at 400 miles long, the Sierra Nevada is the longest mountain range in the US?), near Donner Summit! Student learned to read the landscape to understand the geologic history of this place, all while learning to be stewards of our mountains.
