In Artlandish Productions with Ms. Sonya, students explored the diversity of art from around the world. They cut, sculpted, carved, tore, painted, drew, splashed, and smeared creations reflecting elements of cultural style. Throughout the week, they refined their skills in the principles and elements of art culminating in an open gallery that showcased their finished products!


This was informed by their own trip to a local gallery, where they made observations and met with local artists.

This talented and enthusiastic group of students took various recipes and worked together to convert and enlarge recipes, create them and then feed many other people on campus all week. Students explored nutrition, zooming with a nutritional therapist, built their understanding sourcing food, investigated the school garden, priced out personal recipes at Safeway (comparing conventional to organic), watched several films about food production and "fast food", and ended the week with a wonderful celebration breakfast put on by Tofanellis! With a little luck, student got to show off their new found knowledge this past weekend at home!







Kindergarteners Go Adventuring!

Kindergartners went on their first Adventure of the year, highlighting the character traits of Stewardship, Respect, and Crew as they raise and release Chinook salmon from egg to fry. Our amazing Adventure Teacher, Beth, created a special day where kindergarteners got to experience what it is like for the salmon to return to their natal waters from the ocean to complete their life cycle. Just like the salmon have to swim against the current, evading predators, navigating rapids, and maybe even jumping up fish ladders, the kindergarteners walked ALL DAY - uphill - carrying their own gear the whole time, carefully navigating the rocky terrain, staying with the "school" of kids, helping each other get up steep hills, and they even climbed a mountain at the end! All along the way, they observed the salmon's habitat and survival needs. Many students even got a glimpse of jumping or fighting fish!
