### Pre K, Transitional K and Kindergarten...?!

We are adding Transitional Kindergarten to our Core program next school year! TK is the grade level between Kindergarten and PK. It is all a bit confusing so here is a way to think about it:

**PreK** is for kids 3 years of age, and potty trained. Our PK is a fee-based program. **PK roundup is April 1**<sup>st</sup> **at 1pm.** 

**TK** is for children who will be 5 years of age between 9/2/22 and 2/2/23. Note that students who turn 5 between 2/3/23 and 4/2/23 may also be admitted if space permits. TK is free, and all day.

Kindergarten is for children who will be 5 years of age on or before 9/1/22.
