Girls Volleyball: Open to  $6^{th} - 8^{th}$  graders, the season runs from 2/20 - 4/21


Track: Open to  $4^{th} - 8^{th}$  graders, the season runs from 3/27 - 5/26

#### Parent Homework: Phones & Social Media

After nearly 20 years working in k-8 education, I can say that without a doubt, cellphones and social media are disruptive to the educational environment – and in addition can be a major source of stress, anxiety and a source of social emotional hurdles for kids. The good news, there is a lot that you can do as a parent. First, most kids do not need cellphones. The earliest that my own child might get a cellphone is in high school, I know many, many other school admin with the same perspective. If you do decide to get your student a phone, I strongly encourage you to take some time and review the resources available at <a href="https://www.commonsensemedia.com">www.commonsensemedia.com</a>



The resources here are straight forward and actionable. For example, step by step instructions on how to set up controls on the phone your child uses (notice I didn't say their phone, because it is not theirs, it is yours). This includes things like: allowing you to determine what apps they can have, or not have, what time of day they can access apps (errrr, so maybe not during the school day, or after bedtime), what type of content they can access, etc. For more on setting up a phone for your child in a way that feels appropriate for your family, follow this link.

In addition, Common Sense Media offers great overviews of popular apps among teens. Does your child want to be on, or already is on: SnapChat, Instagram, TikTok, Twitch? Do you understand how they work? How or if you can monitor what your student is sending, or being sent to them? Common Sense Media is a great resource for all of this and more.

Please, take the time to review some of these resources so that you can actively engage with your kids as they access everything that is available on the internet (which is, you know – Everything!).

Top Tips: AKA, Things All Parents Should Know.

- You do not actually need a cellphone carrier to access the web, apps, etc. You can have a phone with no carrier (or an iPad), that can access this content through WiFi. Kids know this, and now you do too.

### **Parent Square For School Communication**

We are in process of adopting Parent Square as a great method of communication with our parent community. The majority of communications from the front office are coming via Parent Square, and teachers are phasing in this method as well. Our goal is clear and consistent communication ranging from informational, to signing up to volunteer, to the ... wait for it... golden goose of digital permission slips! If you have not already accepted the invitation to use Parent Square, I encourage you to do so. If you have any questions, you can contact the front office at 530 273 8723.

#### A few reminders ...

As we get back in to the groove of things, a few reminders that will help things run smoothly.

- Early Drop Off: We love your kiddos, but please do not drop them off before 8:15am. We do not have staff supervision before that time. Students who arrive before 8:15am will be sent to before care which will incur a cost.
- **TK/1 Pick Up:** Thank you for using the placards with the name of your student, their grade and teacher. These help expedite pick up. For parents who are walking in for pick up, please have your placards too. Thank you ;o)
- Pick up for 2<sup>nd</sup> 8<sup>th</sup> grade: A reminder to please turn right when exiting pick up. This prevents cars from getting gridlocked. Thank you ;o)
- Lost & Found: Now is a great time to make sure that names are on anything that your student
  might shed throughout the day. If you find that something has been lost, you are always
  welcome to come in, check in with the office, and look through the lost and found located kitty
  corner from the front office.
- **Student Handbook:** Please review the student handbook with your children and return the signed page indicating that you have done so. This helps establish consistent expectations from the start of the school year.
- **Phones:** Students do not need cell phones on campus. We are happy to relay any message to your student from the front office (530 273 8723) and students are always welcome to call home from the office too. It is our school policy that <u>if</u> students do bring phones to school, they are to remain off and away during school hours, which includes lunch, recess, passing periods, etc. If students do have their phones out, they will be collected by an adult, and parents will be contacted. We also encourage parents to monitor usage, and apps that your kiddos might be using. A great resource is Common Sense Media. Check the "Parenting Tips and FAQ", then "Cellphones", for great info on everything from setting up parental controls, to learning about current apps used by teens.
